## **COLLEGE ACTIVITIES (2014-15)**

### **College Birthday Celebration on 14<sup>th</sup> August 2014**

Last Year's College Annual Foundation Day was celebrated in full spirit and enthusiasm with the presence of Rev. Zosangliana Coleny as the Chief Guest for the Thanksgiving Service. The Foundation day also witnessed the Inauguration of the Memorial Monument by the Chief Guest of the Session, Syiem of Myllem Syiemship, Latho Manink Syiem. The Monument was constructed to commemorate the signing of the Land Gift Deed inked on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of July 2014 by the Syiem in the College Auditorium. The Syiem also inaugurated the UGC funded Outdoor Stadium in the Football Field.

### **Signing of the Land Gift Deed**

The College places on record the signing of the Land Gift Deed which took place on 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2014. The historic moment was made possible by the wisdom and courage taken by the Syiem of Hima Myllem Latho Manik Syiem to donate 300 acres of Land to UCC. The College took this opportunity to extend this humble gratitude and thankfulness to the Syiem of Hima Myllem and his Myntris for their decision to give UCC the Land. ### **Science Stream Silver Jubilee Celebration 2014**

The year 2014 is yet another historic milestone for Union Christian College with the Science stream celebrating its Silver Jubilee of service to the students and the Country as a whole. The Science Stream started with pre- university level Course in the year 1989 which in was later was upgraded to the degree Honours level. To mark the successful completion of its 25 years journey, the Science Stream through College organised a series of programs throughout the year.

Science Stream Silver Jubilee celebration kick started on 12<sup>th</sup> May 2014 in a unique way, with a three- day study tour of Science students, teaching and non- teaching staffs to North-East Institute of Science and Technology (NEIST). The trip also included a visit to Kaziranga National Park. In NEIST our team visited various research laboratories and held discussion with scientist on their work and possibilities of our college to take up similar projects. The students were also demonstrated some experimental setups in the field of plants tissues culture, coal chemistry etc. The visit to Kaziranga was an exciting, memorable and learning experience where all of us had taken safari trip inside the national park.

The 7<sup>th</sup> of August 1989, was the day of commencement of science classes in Union Christian College. To mark this historic day, a function was organised on 7<sup>th</sup> August 2014. The special day was celebrated with the cutting of the Silver Jubilee cake by the Principal and the Pioneer teachers of the Science Stream. On this occasion Mrs Anita G. Paul, Mr. V. Eswar and Mr Joseph Mathew, the teacher from the first batch who are still serving the college were felicitated. The day also marked the inauguration of the U.C.C Science Society. The first

executive committee was installed by the Principal, Dr. S.R. Lyndem. The committee included Dr. V Kalita as President, Dr. Ashish Malhatra as Vice President, Dr. R.M. Manih as secretary, Mrs. Merline Sebastian as treasurer and Dr. J.P. Marak as editor. Before the installation Dr. R.M. Manih highlighted the aim and objectives of the Science Society which focuses on its own perspective in the light of the needs of the college.

The celebration also saw a good participation in an inter college debate competition which was held on 9<sup>th</sup> August 2014 on the topic “Development leads to Environment degradation”. The competition was represented by eight colleges including the host. The participating colleges included St. Edmund College, St Anthony’s College, Lady Keane College, Shillong College, Shillong Commerce College, Sankardev College and Union Christian College. The speaker for the debate was Mrs Deisa P Warboh, Assistant professor, Lady Keane College. The Judges for the competition were Dr. K. Upadhaya, Dept. of Basic Science, N.E.H.U, Mr N. Swer Lady Keane College and Mr. Lawin Pariat, Shillong College. Shillong Commerce College was adjudged as the best team and the Union Christian College bagged the runner’s up.

On the same day a panel discussion on the topic “Ecological Crisis- The Burning Question of the Day” which was conducted by Prof B.K. Tiwari, Dept. of Environment studies N.E.H.U. who was also the Chief guest and the Panellist include Dr. Barnes Mawrie SDB (writer/Environmentalist), Prof. D. Paul, Dept of Environmental Studies N.E.H.U., Mr Q. Lyngdoh, Retired official, Dept. of Tourism, Govt of Meghalaya and Mr. Wanshan Kharkrang, Pollution Department, Govt of Meghalaya. The Panel discussion was chaired by Ms. B.R. Lyngdoh who opened the discussion citing local and global examples of ecological degradation and collapse of the eco-system. The panellist deliberates at length on the challenges and the varying dimensions of ecological crisis that we are facing today. One of the panellists highlighted the Umiam Lake deterioration, which once was one of the cleanest lakes in India. Panellists also contend that environmental degradation is a result of inconsiderate attitude towards nature. The discussion emphasised on creating awareness about the importance of saving environment. The unregulated dumping of waste, use of pesticides and other issues of concern were also discussed. The panellist also remarked that there is tampering of natural process without understanding of the subtle and fragile ecological balance.

On the 13<sup>th</sup> August Basket Ball Invitational match (Boy’s) was organised between Shillong College and Union Christian College. The winner of the match was U.C.C. team. The match was witnessed by students, teachers and staffs. The Occasion was graced by the presence Mr L. Pachau who was the chief guest for the day was and gave away the mementos to the guest team. On the college foundation day, the 14<sup>th</sup> of August, an exclusive and sterling report on the history of the Science stream was given by Mrs A.G. Paul, Head, Dept. of Zoology during the thanksgiving service. To commemorate the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the science, stream, a monument was erected and dedicated to the College. The monument bears the inscription of date of laying of foundation stone of Science building (30<sup>th</sup> May 1987) by Dr .H. J. Tayler, founder Principal U.C.C, starting of first classes under the principal Dr. C.J. John and also in remembrance of the first batch of teachers of Science which includes, Mr James Mathew

(Chemistry department), Ms. Anita Goldsmith (Biology department), Mr Joseph Mathew (Mathematics department) Mr.V. Eswar (Physics department).

College also organised a science exhibition and a science outreach program in the campus as part of Silver Jubilee Celebration. On 21<sup>st</sup> August 2014 a science exhibition was held where different school students from neighbouring schools and college students participated. The exhibition was inaugurated by Dr. S. Sudhakaran, Director, Northeast Space Application Center (NESAC). The guest of honour for the day was Dr. S Kulkarni, outreach officer, Tata Institute of Fundamental Research, Mumbai. Dr. Sudhakaran in his inaugural address emphasised on awareness and importance of scientific temperament. The Science exhibition was followed by a science show by Dr. S. Kulkani from Tata Institute of Fundamental Research where he explained day-to-day experiences of life with scientific reasoning. It was a great academic show for the audiences.

As Part of the celebration, the Science depts. in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) conducted a 3-day national seminar on “Recent Trends in Science and Technology.” The Seminar was held from 24<sup>th</sup> Sept to 26<sup>th</sup> Sept. The Governor of Meghalaya K.K Paul was the Chief Guest for the inauguration and Dr. K.K. Sharma (Scientist) NESAC was the Guest of Honour. Dr K.K. Sharma delivered the keynote address on the seminar theme. There were all together 45 research paper which were presented in the seminar in two parallel sessions. Eight eminent Scientist from N.E.H.U., I.C.A.R., Gauhati University and Assam University were invited as resource person in the seminar who gave talks on various topics of recent trends in science. In the seminar many research papers were presented by scholars and teachers from various fields of science including climate change, genomics and Mat lab.

Our journey of celebration culminated on the 6<sup>th</sup> of November 2014 with a thanksgiving service to God for all his blessings and the inauguration of the new Physics and Chemistry Laboratory respectively by the Chief Guest, Dr. C. Lyngdoh, Local MLA. On behalf of all UCCians I wish the college and specially the Science Depts. greater Glory of selfless dedication ahead.


